The attached Funeral Planning Form is designed so that you may share your wishes about your funeral with your family and with Trinity Episcopal Church. The Form can also assist family members planning a service for a loved one who has died.

The Burial Service in the *Book of Common Prayer* is the foundation of an Episcopal funeral service. If Holy Eucharist has been an important part of your life, including Holy Eucharist as part of your burial service may be important. Or, you may prefer have a Memorial Service without communion.

The lessons included in this guide are from the Burial Service in *The Book of Common Prayer*, beginning on page 468; you may have other passages you would like used. Also, *The Hymnal 1982* has a wide selection of hymns; familiar, easy to sing hymns invite full participation of all those present.

As you consider your funeral plans or those of a loved one who has died, both our Organist and Parish Musician, Mr. Brian MacFarland, and I will be glad to assist you. Please contact either or both of us if you have questions or if you would like to talk about the service you are planning.
